Nagypáli is one of the founding communities of the RURENER network. The village is located in the typical landscape of the Zalai hills in Hungary, surrounded by forests and orchards. The small streams running in the valleys at the bottom of the hills, the peaceful forest clearings, the well-organized fields and the green meadows radiate a special tranquility. Back in 1997, the newly elected mayor Tibor Köcse initiated the Green Road program, a program designed to transform Nagypáli, into a self-sustaining village of an advanced European standard, preserving the traditions of the Hungarian culture and the traditions of the Zala villages. 25 years later, it's well underway and the village has bloomed, increasing its population from 271 to 650 inhabitants. Nagypáli is now famous for its capacity to innovate and receives visitors from all over Europe. From the building of the Energy Park to the smart benches and self-driving cars track, nothing seems impossible for this small Hungarian village.

So it made complete sense to organize the final event of the LINK-EU project in Nagypáli, figure of rural innovation for sustainability, to promote our Rural Resilience Roadmap. This year's programme combines inspiring visits and workshops dedicated to launching the new RURENER advocacy strategy promoting a shared sustainable development framework and key messages.
